1. Demonstrate safety
2. Understand cabinet layout design
3. Interpret/Read blueprints to include:
 - Floor plan
 - Elevations
 - Cabinets
4. Identify cabinet materials:
 - Solid woods
 - Sheet goods
 - Hardware
 - Cabinet finishes
5. Create a bill of materials
6. Construct and install a:
 - Cabinet
 - Door
 - Drawer
 - Shelf
 - Face frame
7. Prep project for finish
8. Apply finish

Assessments:

Students must achieve no less than 80% or B for a final grade in the high school course to receive ACC.
