Curriculum Content Objectives

To receive credit, students will perform each of the following content objectives:

Demonstrate professional automotive technician behavior, acceptable attendance, and demonstrate shop safety.

Explain and demonstrate electrical safety procedures.

Define electrical terms. Identify electrical symbols, components, and controls.

Calculate series, parallel, and series-parallel using Ohm's Law. Measure series, parallel, and series-parallel using Ohm's Law. Define the basic principles of magnetism and the principle of generation. Demonstrate test light use.

Demonstrate and interpret Digital Multi-Meter (DMM) readings. Demonstrate soldering techniques.

Replace terminals and connectors.

Construct electrical circuits.

Measure voltage, amperage, and resistance in electrical circuits. Identify wiring diagram component locations.

Identify circuit controls.

Explain circuit problems.

Trace circuits.

Identify wire gauge size and circuit protection.

Test diode operation.

Explain transistor operation.

Identify Integrated Circuit (IC) protection procedures.

Perform battery safety, testing, diagnostics and charging.

Identify and test for parasitic drain.

Assessments

Students must achieve no less than 80% or B for a final grade in the high school course to receive ACC. SP2 certification may be used for the safety portion of the course. For partial earned college credits, students must take the course at the college with a tuition discount.

ACC Concept

Through Articulated College Credit (ACC), specific college curriculum content goals and assessments are embedded in participating high school career and technical education (CTE) programs as specified in this agreement. Relevant knowledge, skills, and standards are taught by qualified CTE high school instructor(s) in one or more high school course. ACC is awarded if the student meets the college equivalency standards and later enrolls in the college(s) listed below requiring the course in a specific program.
